News from MRIA

MRIA Board votes funds to improve 1600-1700 Park Ave. median parks John Kyle reported that the medians in the 1600 and 1700 blocks of Park Ave need maintenance: the shubbery needed to be trimmed, fallen branches needed to be removed, and some new trees should be added to the trees already there. He asked that MRIA hire the necessary landscapers with the proper equipment for the maintenance and to purchase eight or 10 new trees to stage the aging of the trees. The Board voted to adopt his suggestions taking the money from the Parks North of McMechen Fund for the shrubbery trimming and branch removal, and to purchase eight to ten trees using the money donated by Netflix for BH's cooperation during the filming of House of Cards.

AVAM opens new exhibit The Art of Storytelling Lies, Enchantment, Humor, and Truth Oct. 6, 2012, through Sept. 1, 2013 \$

People tell stories in a variety of artistic forms: sculpture, painting, embroidery, fairy tales, graffiti, film, diorama, photography. The American Visionary Art Museum's 18th yearlong, thematic exhibition explores the impact of story via visual narratives created by more than 30 artists, including the 36 embroidered panels of Holocaust survivor Esther Krinitz that depict her Polish village and family and her escape from the Nazis. Other artists include Vanessa German who builds powerful figures from household objects, Debbie and Mike Schramer and their Fairy Tree Houses, Judy Tallwing, Mars Tokyo, and filmmakers, photographers, collectors of historic artifact, and others presenting narrative, artfully.
