News from MRIA

Joe Horvath was nominated and elected to replace Jon Kuskcar, who resigned, as 2nd vice-president and member of the Executive Committee.

New Neighbor Party The MRIA will host our annual New Neighbor party to welcome people who have moved into the neighborhood since our last party in November 2011. BPD report Officer Fields of the Baltimore City Police Department reported that the crime calls had dropped significantly during the month of November; she also described the status of recent crimes in Bolton Hill: She noted a significant drop in crime (reported incidents); six auto larcenies reported; one robbery since last month; three burglaries (includes 1 forced entry), one common assault

A shooting on McMechen Street in late November at Pedestal Gardens was an apparent drug crime; suspect identified; awaiting warrant;

Assault on Wilson Street on Dec. 4 – may or may not have been reported. Assault of a young woman on Lafayette Ave last week on her walk to school; Officer Fields is following-up with Midtown Academy administrators.

She encouraged neighbors to report suspicious activity when they see it. MICA tips for safety are included at the end of the Bulletin.

Report from MCBD Working Group As a reminder, this group was convened due to a significant disagreement about the future of the Midtown Community Benefits District (MCBD), comprising Bolton Hill, Madison Park, Charles North, and Mt. Vernon. Two neighborhoods want a dollar-for-dollar "return" on their surtax contribution or what they believe to be "equal services for the dollar value of their surtax con-

tribution." This method would result in a reduction in services to the two smaller neighborhoods and an increase in services to the two larger neighborhoods. The Working Committee has attempted to document and determine the cost of current services provided by Midtown, but has not been able to reach agreement on those numbers or the method used to determine cost. To reduce the tension over this issue, a consultant was hired to speak with representatives from each neighbourhood and to prepare a report; but many of the meetings that followed did not settle the differences; some neighborhoods advocate leaving the larger group, either to form a separate district and/or joining another benefit district. During these meetings and discussions, other suggestions emerged, such as a tiered tax district to apply higher assessments where welcomed, to give associations more control over the distribution of the surtax revenues, to analyze inputs and outputs to measure results, to use committees to develop improvements. Each neighborhood is meeting to discuss these options, as we are, and how that neighborhood would prefer to move forward. The Working Group will meet on Dec. 13, and the Associations' presidents will vote the neighborhood's choice about the future of MBCD. A motion was made, seconded, and passed that MRIA preferred to keep the MBCD intact and funded as it is currently and that our president should vote accordingly.

Communications Committee to form A committee has been established to determine the best use of BHEN, the Bolton Hill Email Network. This committee will include Polly Duke, Doreen Rosenthal, and Richard Rosenthal. Doreen was the originator of the communication rules used to operate BHEN. Lat Naylor, a native of Baltimore, currently works and lives on Park Avenue with his wife, Barbara, their two young sons, and a large dog. Lat's art work has been shown and collected in the United States, Japan and Europe since the late 1990's. Lat attended Princeton University and earned earned a degree

in urban studies and sociology in 1984. Two years later, he dropped out of the graduate school of urban planning at the University of California, Berkeley to enroll in the Fashion Institute. IIn 1988 he established his own clothing design and manufacturing business in San Francisco. He made a name for himself over the next ten years with his straightforward approach to design and fabrication and garnered an international following and numerous awards including California Designer of the Year and CFDA rising star. in 1998 Lat closed the clothing company to concentrate on making sculptures, paintings, and assemblages. In 2002 Lat returned to Baltimore and began a five-year sculpture/ renovation project at 1515 Park
