Report from the Baltimore City Police Department

Major Marcus, Central District commander, apologized for not having police representation at last month's meeting. Major Marcus wanted us to know that the Central District was down 37 officers from last year at this time (early January), a 50% increase in vacancies, or an entire shift of officer coverage. Major Marcus has put staff not in traditional street roles into pa-

trol cars to cover vacancies to cover the district. But, good news! Thirteen new officers started in the Central District this week!! And in addition the Central District has new resources from Midtown Benefits District. Encouraging, says Major Marcus.

Crime Stats – Overall crime in Bolton Hill went up by nearly 4% in 2013, compared to 2012, due largely to increases in larceny (16.9%) and auto thefts (23.1%). Violent crimes, aggravated assault and robbery, were down by 13.5%.

Major Marcus reported that the robberies that occurred in mid to late December took place in off hours, such as very early morning. The 12/18 robbery was in the 200 block of Lafayette and involved a 12-year-old suspect with a gun. A juvenile with a BB gun matching this description was apprehended and BPD is hoping to make a match. The three other robberies are still open investigations (as of Jan. 7). Maj. Marcus and Capt. Howe urged neighbors to call police If something looks suspicious and report it. Call 911, and then call Major Marcus directly at 410-404-9111 or Captain Howe directly at 443-845-7685 so they are aware of the incident as soon as possible.

The Safety Committee has identified twelve areas to focus on and have volunteers to head four of them. 
