News from MRIA

New City Council Member to replace Cole Bill Cole, our neighborhood city council representative since 2007 recently resigned to become the CEO of the Baltimore Development Corporation. He was appointed by Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake in the middle of his second term as Councilman for District 11, which includes Bolton Hill and much of downtown Baltimore. John Kyle, two-time president of MRIA praised Cole's commitment to Bolton Hill: "Councilman Cole has been a fierce advocate for our neighborhood, our district, and our city. He will be missed. However, he is sure to provide positive results for all of us from his new work at the Baltimore Development Corporation (BDC)". According to the Baltimore Sun, "a new city law on filling a council vacancy will be tested for the first time. City Council President Bernard C. "Jack" Young has the task of creating a committee with at least 13 members—mostly from community groups—to nominate a finalist for Cole's seat." The committee will hold a public hearing to hear those interested in the seat, then within 30 days of the hearing, send a nomination to the Council. The names of the nominating committee are posted on the City Council website.



Tom Hasler keeps father's legacy alive. After making a well-received documentary about his father, The Immortal Balladeer of Prague, Tom Hasler hopes to make a feature movie with Matej Minac a Czech film director, about his famous father who was executed by the Nazis for his anti-Nazi songs. Karel Hasler, Tom's father, whom he never met, was very wellknown in Czechoslovakia between the World Wars, as an actor, singer, song writer, and director, but is now known mostly for his songs of Old Prague. In fact, his most famous song, "Our Czech Song" became the unofficial Czech anthem after the Nazis banned the national anthem when they took over Czechoslovakia. Strongly nationalistic, Karel had a political side, and his songs mocked the Nazis, the Bolsheviks, and Czech politicians. Karel was executed soon after Tom was born, so Tom never met his father. He and his mother Charlotte stayed in German-occupied Prague until the Communists took over and then escaped, emigrating to Australia, where Tom "forgot" his Czech, learned English, and tried to assimilate. Mother and son moved to the US in 1958, where Tom went to college and graduate school, studying journalism. After two years at an English language newspaper in Beirut, where he met and married his wife, Bonnie, a New Yorker, Tom sought work at a major daily newspaper. And he and Bonnie moved to Baltimore where Tom worked at the *Evening Sun*, covering "downtown" while William Donald Schafer was mayor. Bonnie worked for the state of Maryland in human services and later as a consultant in Washington. After a few years in Baltimore, they bought a house and moved to Bolton Hill, even though they had heard the neighborhood was "stuck-up." But after joining the pool to test the BH reputation, they found a welcoming, friendly

neighborhood and Tom has been here ever since, serving twice on the MRIA board and once on the swim club board. In the 1980s, encouraged by Bonnie, who sadly died in 1995, Tom left journalism, wanting to try new things, and he has done so. He now considers himself semi-retired with a special interest in new uses of technology, currently aquaponics and online games and, of course, his interest in the documentary and possible film about his father. The love story of Tom's mother and father began at Karel's 60th birthday party at a nightclub in Prague, during the Nazi occupation of Czechoslovakia. Even with a great age and cultural difference, she was 29 and German, they became a couple. They tried to marry, but it was not allowed. Even though he had been banned from public performing, Karel continued to write and privately perform anti-Nazi songs. Inevitably, The Gestapo arrested him; he died at the Mauthausen concentration camp a month after Tom was born. Tom "met" his father for the first time on a moving picture screen in Manhattan in 1990, the first time he'd seen his father move or show emotion. With the fall of Communism in the early 90s Tom started re-connecting with his Czech background. In 2006 he traveled to Prague to make the documentary The Immortal Balladeer of Prague, at the suggestion of the late Arnost Lustig, a Holocaust survivor and the author of many books about the Holocaust. The documentary has been shown not only in Czechoslovakia, but in Baltimore, Washington, and New York; it will be shown by the Czechosolvak Society of Arts and Sciences in New York on Sept. 12. As Arnost Lustig said of Karel Hasler, "He may be dead, but he's also very much alive." If you want a free copy of The Immortal Balladeer of Prague, contact thasler@comcast.com
