blues in **Memorial Players**' masterful presentation of the musical Oliver! at Bolton Hill's Memorial Episcopal Church, opening Friday, February 3, 2012 with six live performances over two weekends.

The musical Oliver! penned by Lionel Bart puts an uplifting spin on Charles Dickens' otherwise dark tale. Bart finds "small pleasures" in the midst of misery and audience members will discover themselves "at home" and "one of the family," captivated by such rousing numbers as "It's A Fine Life" and the toe-tapping "Oom-Pah-Pah," plus melting at the haunting melodies of "Where Is Love" and "Who Will Buv."

Timoth David Copney, who directs Memorial Players' Oliver!, stays true to the musical composed by Bart in 1960 while putting his own stamp on this artfully choreographed production which features a multi-generational cast of accomplished area talent.

In rehearsals since October, the musical will be staged at Memorial Episcopal Church, a parish in the heart of the Bolton Hill community at 1407 Bolton Street. A cast of 60 adults. teenagers and children will sing, dance and act the roles including both newcomers and familiar favorite performers from previous Memorial productions. Show producers are Julie Modlin, Lois Sullivan and Beth Steinrock.

Under the vision of set designer **John Seelev**. the church transforms into scenes from London's seedier as well as fashionable sides. Cast and crew fashioned a 1,000 square foot stage whose set includes an elevated workhouse parlor and part of the famous London Bridge.

We hope Oliver! will be a chance to find hope in our city and work towards a Baltimore where all may eat and find a safe and secure place to call home."

> While no tickets are required, donations are welcome. Patrons also may register on-line in advance to attend pre-show receptions that come with a limited number of reserved seats for \$40 per person. Proceeds will help support the church's community outreach efforts. Additionally, food will be collected at shows for the pantry at Samaritan Community, a nonprofit housed at Memorial Episcopal. Doors will open half an hour before show times with seats available on a first-come, first-served basis. Most previous shows have been at standing-room-only capacity so early arrivals are suggested. Performances are as follows: Friday/Saturday, February 3/4 at 7:30 p.m.; Sunday, February 5 at 3:00 p.m.; Friday/Saturday, February 10/11 at 7:30 p.m.; and on Sunday, February 12 at 3:00 p.m. For more information about the show, or for program ad space, call the church at memorialplayers.org.


