It is time for a summer break. The next meeting of the MRIA Board will be held on September 4 at 8 p.m. in the upper Parish Hall of Memorial Episcopal Church (enter on Lafayette Street). All residents are encouraged to attend.

News from MRIA

The Midtown Community Benefits District is a city-chartered, neighborhood-run advocacy and improvement group that provides joint security, sanitation, and promotional activities for four geographically linked neighborhoods--Bolton Hill, Madison Park, Mt. Vernon, and Charles North. Midtown was created in 1996 and must be reauthorized at least every four years by the Baltimore City Council. Midtown's current reauthorization expires on June 30, 2012.

Over the past several months, MRIA representatives have been in discussions with the Midtown Board about issues that concern the four neighborhoods. For example, some Midtown Board members proposed a 38 percent tax increase to raise revenue to, among other things, install high tech security cameras in parts of the District. While MRIA voted against this tax increase, representatives from other neighborhoods supported it. The Midtown Board ultimately voted down this substantial tax increase. Also recently, another proposal looked to limit the length of Midtown's reauthorization, usually four years, to one year to address funding distribution concerns within the neighborhoods. The Mt. Vernon-Belvedere Association (MVBA) for example, complained that the Midtown funding structure is inequitable, suggesting that MVBA residents and businesses provide a disproportionately large percentage of funding for the services they receive. However, Bolton Hill's representatives note that the Midtown Board has not conducted a recent study of the funding structure or measured the monetary value of services provided to each neighborhood.

The MRIA Board voted unanimously to oppose this proposed change in reauthorization by the City Council, preferring the certainty of a four-year authorization. MRIA President Joe Palumbo met with the other neighborhood presidents to address the MVBA concern and recognizes the urgency to find common ground on unresolved issues.

olton Hill Garden Club awards Green Space Grants

In order to encourage residents to beautify our neighborhood's public spaces, the BHGC awards monetary grants for planting and maintaining our streets and other public spaces. This year the BHGC awarded over \$5,381, ranging from \$160 to \$1,000 for planting of annuals in the urns and fountains on Eutaw Place and North Avenue, and 12 Skimma Japonicas in Rutter Mill Park, to replace a tree that had been removed on Lanvale, for labor costs to move 15 large maple trees in Lion Park, to install roses, azaleas, bulbs and annuals in John St. Park, to replace perennials in Sumpter Park, for gator bags,

rose bushes, and mulch in Lanvale Triangle, for ground cover to prevent weeds in Fitzgerald Park, and plants, pavers, and drought-resistant plants to make Sumpter Park more useable as a community gathering place. For a complete listing, see the **boltonhillgardenclub.org** website.

The funds for these grants come from four fund-raising events held each year: pansy sale, holiday greens sale, spring plant sale, and summer garden walk. Thank you, BHGC.

Bolton Hill Nursery launches \$1million capital campaign. Tom Nealis, BHN Board President, announced that after lengthy consideration about the possibility of buying the house at 204 West Lanvale, currently owned by Family Children's Services of Central Maryland, BHN has delayed the purchase due to concerns about the nursery school's long-term financial position.

But Nealis noted that they are still "passionate" about owning the building. Therefore, the BHN has launched a \$1million capital campaign, Building Our Future, to raise the money for purchase and renovation of the building. This will allow BHN much needed larger classrooms and play space and will help BHN continue to attract home buyers and families to BH.

According to Bill Wells, board vice-president, long-time BH resident and nursery school alum, "We can't risk of the BHN's financial future. It's the perfect building for us, but we have to have the financial resources first to purchase the building. We believe the money and support is there to build our future at 204 Lanvale before it goes to another buyer."

Preston (open 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.); Tuesdays at Kenilworth, (3:30 to 6:30). 
