Officer Morales reported that there have been two car jackings in the past month. A Baltimore police officer is on patrol in Bolton Hill frequently, but the police have a no pursuit policy.

Bill Hamilton is the coordinator for the Bolton Hill Grey Panthers, an organization created to support aging residents who want to remain in Bolton Hill. On Wednesday, October 25th, they will sponsor a program regarding the new law governing cannabis use. Dr. Dan Morhaim will be the speaker from 6-8 pm at Linden Park Senior Housing.

Festival on the Hill will take place on October 7th, rain or shine. At 2:15 p.m. the Festival will honor Lottie Shivers who started Festival on the Hill in 1955.

Lynne Cripps and Barbara Blumberg announced that five new Blue Plaques have been approved for installation in the neighborhood.

Lisa Johnson on behalf of the Bolton Hill Garden Club announced that pansies would be on sale at Festival on the Hill and that the Garden Club was sponsoring an Audubon Society speaker to discuss gardening for birds.
